Board of Trustees Meeting

January 13th, 2021

Present: Mayor Cal Lathan, Chris Genthner, Dan Coon, Rhonda Roeser, Chris Hoffmann, Annette Meade and Bill Kurtz.

Mayor Lathan called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

This meeting was an online ZOOM meeting.

M/2/C (D. Coon, C. Genthner) to approve the minutes from the December 9^{th} , 2020 meeting. Passed 5 – 0. Mayor Lathan stated that a large portion of the minutes covered information pertaining to Local Law #1-2020.

M/2/C (B. Kurtz, D. Coon) to approve the minutes from the December 22^{nd} , 2020 Fire Commissioner Appointment of P. J. Dwyer. Please find attached the minutes that were submitted by Bill Kurtz. Passed 5-0.

M/2/C (B. Kurtz, D. Coon) to reaffirm the appointment of P. J. Dwyer. Passed 5-0.

M/2/C (C. Genthner, A. Meade) to approve the payment of claims # 164 to # 190 in the amount of \$22,770.19. Passed 5-0.

DPW Foreman Chris Hoffmann

Curb Cuts

Chris Hoffmann discussed with the Board a Curb Cut that was needed on Spring Street. This work cost \$863.00. It is Chris's recommendation that this type of fee could be passed on to the Homeowner at roughly \$25.00 per foot. Chris will write a proposal to the Board for consideration.

Reservations for Parks

Chris Hoffmann suggested that the Village could charge a fee to those interested in reserving either Bowen Park or Community Park. This fee would cover water usage and the bathrooms.

Recreational Vehicles

Chris Hoffmann recommended that consideration be given regarding recreational vehicles, campers, utility trailers and boats that park for extended periods of time on either Village Streets or in the Village right – of- ways. He mentioned several

instances from this past year.

The Board Members also discussed various political signs that were still posted throughout the Village. Several Board Members suggested talking with Adam Backus.

The Livonia Village Board seeks to begin taking steps toward transitioning our water transmission and distribution system to the control of the Authority. It is our goal to shed all responsibility for the operation and maintenance of our system. With this letter, we would like to formalize a commitment to enter negotiations with the Authority.

We propose that the joint Unity Task Force be charged with developing a process for working through the details of an agreement.

As part of the process, we would like to review our current sewer system lease agreement and determine if any changes are warranted.
